## Pack 233 Campership Policy

We try very hard to keep the cost of Scouting realistic for all to enjoy. Under no circumstances does the Pack profit from conducting Scouting activities. All activities are budgeted with a zero bottom line.

Annually, Pack 233 conducts several fundraisers to offset the cost of Scouting for each individual Scout. In addition to these fundraisers we also accept donations year-round. Most of this money is used to supplement the Pack so that Scouts and parents do not need to worry about equipment, and other miscellaneous costs.

Scouts are encouraged pay their way and earn money towards den dues and support Pack fundraising effort. However, "no deserving Scout will be denied Scouting due to financial hardship". This means that any Scout that participates in "helping the Pack go" (i.e. fundraising, service hours, recruiting, public relations, etc.), will have the opportunity to enjoy Scouting to its fullest.

Camperships are available. Camperships enable Scouts to have a summer camp (or other Pack activity) experience who, because financial needs, could not otherwise attend. Limited financial assistance is available on an individual basis for those Scouts and their families. Camperships are sponsorships from individuals, corporations, and the Pack for individual Scouts based on need. Please contact the Cubmaster if you'd like to be considered for a campership. All requests for a campership are kept confidential. Camperships are reviewed on first come – first serve basis.

If a family accepts a campership during the Webelo II year, then the funds that would be issued from fundraisers to a Boy Scout troop for an individual troop account will be forfeited.

### **Campership process:**

1. Scout or family requests a campership by contacting the Cubmaster
2. Campership request is reviewed by the Campership committee:
  - a. Cubmaster,
  - b. Committee Chair, and
  - c. Treasurer.
3. Decision is a consensus decision.
4. Results are communicated to requesting family.
